SBA's Role in Commercial Financing


- Guarantee loans that lenders will not finance on their own due to:
- 1. Collateral Shortfalls (SBA is cash-flow driven)
- Change of Ownership/Partner Buyout(s)
- 3. Start-Ups/New Business
- 4. Longer maturity needed (up to 25 year term)
- 5. Out of Lender's credit policy guidelines



How Can an SBA-backed Loan Help You?



- Launch, grow, or repair a start-up
- Start or purchase a small business
- Access revolving credit or working capital for day-today expenses



- Purchase, renovate, or expand facilities
- Purchase inventory, equipment, or machinery
- Purchase land or real estate
- Export a product or service

- Counseling and education



Fund Innovations with the SBIR-STTR Program

If you are a technology-focused small business looking to fund research and development or prototyping operations, you may qualify for **federal grants** from 11 federal agencies participating in the SBIR-STTR program.



Key areas for funding include:

- Clean energy
- Water filtration
- Education technology
- Wearable technology


